Now some programs from early Bruckner-Fest programs.

From 1936, celebrating the 40th anniversary of Bruckner's death, there are two items. The first is an invitation to the Grossen Festsaal der Wiener Universität for the "Festversammlung". The event included a performance of the G minor Overture under Ferdinand Grossmann, a speech by the president of the Internationalen Bruckner-Gesellschaft Prof. Max Auer, and concluded with laying a crown of flowers at Bruckner's statue found in the courtyard of the University.

The second item from 1936 is the detailed overview of the Bruckner-Fest in Vienna which took place from the 7-15 of October.

Next we have a booklet from the 1939 Fest, which became the Grossdeutsches Brucknerfest and the Deutsche Bruckner-Gesellschaft after the Austrian "Anschluss". The Fest took place in Linz, St. Florian and Vienna from the 30 June- 5 July. The program is in immaculate condition.

A 1946 Wiener Bruckner-Fest program for a Kammer Konzert with a mixed program of organ, choir, and chamber works as well as lieder.

A 1933 program to celebrate 75 years of the Singverein. **Ferdinand Grossmann** conducted the Mass No. 3

A 1910 booklet for a Festkonzert celebrating 10 years of the Wiener Konzert-Verein **Ferdinand Löwe** conducted the 9th Symphony. Immaculate condition.
